Filmmaking

Introductory level 16mm film production class that familiarizes students with basic photographic and cinematic principles in time based media. Introduced key terms and technical concepts related to production and post-production workflow. Created short film exercises and related assignments that culminate in a final project of dual system film and sound.

Editing

Introductory film+video editing combines theory with practice by introducing students to the history of film editing, practical editing technique, editing tradition and conventions, aesthetic and genre specific styles related to the craft of editing, alternative approaches, as well as a basic overview of HD post production workflow. Through a series of lectures, in-class exercises, projects and assignments, students learn film language, scene grammar, the fundamentals of shot sequencing, narrative structure, edit progression and digital post production technique.

Experimental Video

Among my favorite classes to teach. Introduced critical readings that frame the tradition of avantgarde cinema, showcased essential works and contemporary time based media. Facilitated discussions about nature of experimental media, hybrid modes and visual strategies. Hosted visiting artists that shared their personal practice and engaged students about the nature of experimental media strategies through discussion.
